

DOCTORS PROPOSE TORTURE BILL

"The spotless white corridors gleam in the morning sunlight creeping in through opened windows; the first breezes of spring speak of new life bursting forth. And suddenly a shriek of terror fills the atmosphere; spring and sudden death—an ironic mixture. The medicine men have won another victory; another of man's best friends lies dead, victim of torturers so foul as to shame even Hitler's dreaded S.S. As we are finding out Germany does not have a monopoly on depraved individuals. But in this country such in-

dividuals, prohibited by law from practicing their grisly profession on other human beings, use helpless animals to satisfy their perverted needs." The above is an eyewitness account of what has become a daily—or would hourly be more correct—occurrence in all of our hospitals and medical colleges today. 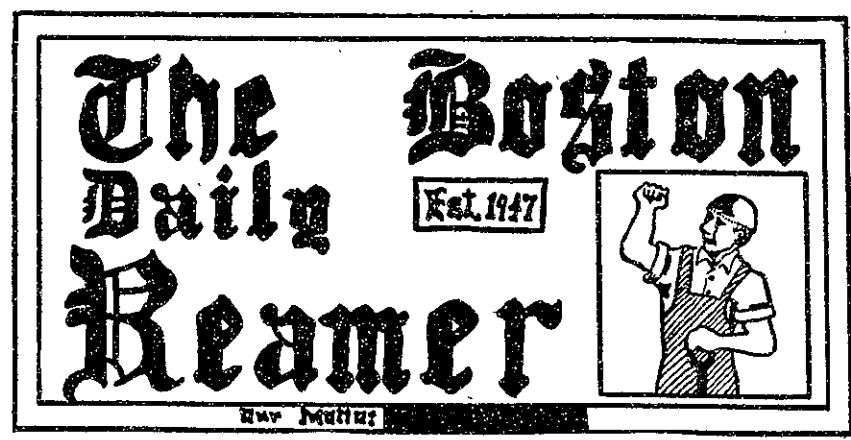

All of the \$25,000 stolen from the Tech Coop last Friday was returned this morning in much the same manner it was taken. A man suddenly appeared near the cashier's desk in back of the Coop, planked the bag containing the 25 grand on the same spot from which it was taken, and disappeared as before, only empty handed. In spite of the more desirable circumstances of the "return," three girls fainted, several students dashed out brandishing slide rules and the police were on the scene within a few seconds, whereas it was half an hour before a squad car was available in the robbery. All observers agreed that the "returner" leaped into a new flashy red Buick convertible and dashed off in all directions. **POLICE CONFISCATE BUICK** A few minutes later, the getaway car was reported parked near the Harvard Coop. Police immediately took it into custody. That evening an irate local executive of the Harvard Trust reported his new red Buick convertible stolen from near the Bank. Police immediately sent out alerts.

Gen. Mire For President Trend Gains Popular Support In Nation



Shielding his face from the tumultuous reception, accorded him by a large, enthusiastic crowd, General Emmett Mire leaves for Up-the-River, his first stop on a goodwill tour in regards to coming presidential election.

Dogcart, Idaho, April 1 (OPC)—Enthusiastic reports from campaign leaders all over the nation highlighted the last days before the opening of the conference of the Mire for President Committee. The announcement

was made in response to a spontaneous groundswell of public opinion that has swept the country recently. In his opening acceptance speech the general commented, "I bow to the will of the people. In

Communists In Baseball World Blasted Into Open By Govt. Probe

In a surprise move that threatened the heart of the nation's favorite pastime, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities launched a probe into the baseball world in an effort to ferret out the influences of Communism. Acting upon suggestions taken from the national press, which has designated the baseball commissioner as "Commissar" B. A. "Chappy" Handler, and the Cincinnati ball club as the "Reds," these two government organizations moved swiftly. The Committee head, Senator

Claghorn, announced that Mr. Handler has been taken into custody and all members of the Cincinnati ball team have been interned in their local hotel pending a further investigation. In commenting, the senator said: "It is fantastic that this hotbed

JEFFERSON'S ROUGH DRAFT OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

A Declaration by the Representatives of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in General Congress assembled

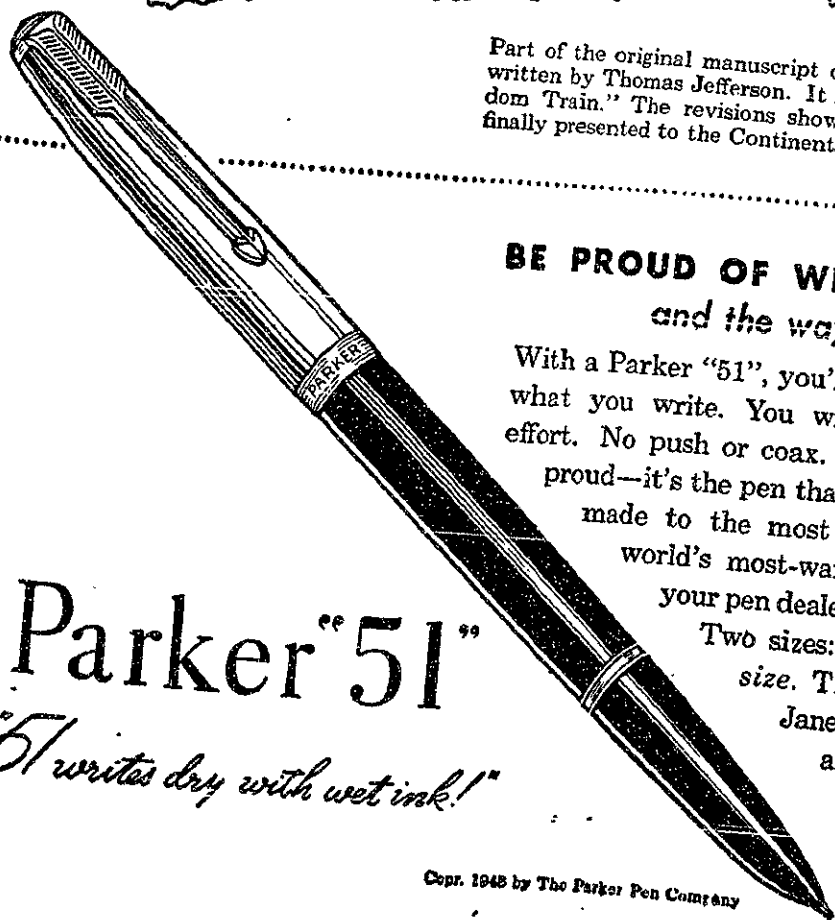
When in the course of human events it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth the separate and equal station to which the laws of nature and of nature's god entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; that to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed; that whenever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or to abolish it, & to institute new government, laying its foundation on such principles & organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall

Part of the original manuscript of the Declaration of Independence, written by Thomas Jefferson. It is now on display aboard the "Freedom Train." The revisions shown were included in the document finally presented to the Continental Congress.
