Ballots for election of men to fill vacant offices in the Society, should be left at the Cage, or delivered personally to Wm. H. Keen, President, before Monday, October 17.

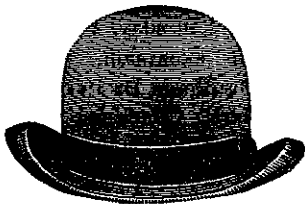
Third Year Civils.**Hoosac Tunnel Excursion.**
