## WORLD'S FAIR AWARDS.

### Technology Awarded Medals and Prizes.

The following has been received from our St. Louis correspondent, by Special Postal Telegraph Dispatch:

St. Louis, Sept. 26, 1904.

Mr. Gay, in charge of the Massachusetts School Exhibits, informs me that, according to official report on the Massachusetts awards, Technology is the winner of six prizes, as follows:

One, Grand prize for General Exhibit. Two, Gold Medal for Mining Engineering Exhibit. Three, Silver Medal for special exhibit of Analytical Chemistry. Four, Silver Medal for special exhibit of Drawing. Five, Silver Medal for special exhibit of Photography, Students' Work, etc. Six, Bronze Medal for special exhibit of Transparencies.

These six prizes were awarded to the M. I. T. Exhibit in the group of higher education, which included as competitors all the colleges and universities, scientific, technical and engineering institutions, professional schools, libraries, and museums, represented by an exhibit.

### Brighton High—11. 1908—5.

Brighton High defeated 1908 at Roger's Park last Wednesday, by the score of 11 to 5. Both teams played a good snappy game, and it was not until near the end of the second half that Brighton succeeded in making the winning touchdown.
