CROSS COUNTRY RACE.

Tech Wins from Harvard 38-40.

E. H. Lorenz (Tech), was the first to reach the field, followed, at about 150 yards, by W. G. Howard (Harvard). The next men entered in the following order: third, H. R. Callaway (Tech); fourth, K. W. Lamson (Harvard); fifth, P. J. Clapp (Tech); sixth, H. H. Rowland (Harvard); seventh, M. S. More (Tech); eighth, C. J. Jackman (Harvard); ninth, S. Whitaker (Harvard); tenth, B. S. Gimson (Tech); eleventh, M. Crosby (Harvard); twelfth, M. E. McGregor (Tech.)

The men ran a lap and a half on the field and finished in the same order, Tech winning by the score of 38 to 40. Time of winner 24 min., 58 sec.

The Cross Country race started from West Roxbury promptly at 1.45 p.m. The runners were in the best of condition and the weather good for cross country running. Lorenz set the pace throughout the race with the other runners well bunched. There was a constant changing of positions, which kept the result much in doubt, and lent excitement to the race.

1908 Wins Tug-of-War.

When the pistol was fired for the tug-of-war, '08 began pulling the ribbon towards their flag. It slowly moved toward the freshman line and by a powerful pull, when the ribbon was only a foot from the flag, '08 pulled it over. The time was one minute eighteen and three-fifths seconds.

1907 WINS FIELD DAY.

Sophomores Take Football Game and Tie Relay Race. Freshman Win Tug-of-War. Score 1907 5½, 1908 3½.

Those who have watched the active and spirited preparations for the fourth Technology Field Day were not disappointed in their belief that we would have this year the best Field Day which has yet been held. In every way the Field Day was a splendid beginning for the many which will in the future be held at Technology Field.

The victory in the Cross Country race with Harvard put every one in the best of humor and gave a start to the cheering which compared favorably with that of previous years.

The attendance was very encouraging. The grandstand was full, as were the bleachers, while some two hundred others were not in the stands.

The first event, the football game, looked doubtful for the first few minutes of play, but before the end of the first half it was evident that the Sophomore Team was superior. They made two touchdowns in the first half and two in the second half and kicked two goals, giving a final score of 22-0. While 1907 made steady gains, it was only by hard fighting for every yard.

The relay race was run off between the halves of the football game. It was extremely closely contested and was by far the most exciting relay race that Technology has seen in a long while. At no time did either class lead by more than twenty feet; nor did either hold the lead for more than two laps. In the final relay the freshman started with six feet lead, but this was gradually reduced until the finish when there was considerable doubt among the spectators as to the winner. The judges announced a dead heat, and the three points accredited to the event were accordingly evenly divided.

In the tug-of-war, the freshmen obtained a slight advantage at the very first, which they gradually increased until after a pull of a minute and a quarter, the centre of the rope reached their flag.

The customary rushes followed the events and were conducted in an orderly and spirited manner.

The Game in Detail.

FIRST HALF.

At 2.35 p.m., '07 kicked off to 25-yard line. The ball was returned five yards. Putnam carried the ball 3 yards, Boylston 3 yards, Putnam 5 yards, Boylston 2 yards. '08 fumbled but regained the ball. Child kicked to 50 yard line. Lamont carried the ball 40 yards. '07 fumbled but Tetlow fell on ball on 10-yard line. Fuller carried the ball 1 yard. '08 was penalized to the 5-yard line. Fuller went through left guard for 11-2 yards, and then carried the ball over for a touchdown, after nine minutes of play. A punt out by Tetlow failed. Score, 5-0.

'07 kicked off to 15-yard line. '08 fumbled but Barnes recovered the ball. Child kicked to Fuller at 30-yard line. Lamont carried the ball to the 18-yard line, and next time made 2 yards. Fuller went through left guard for 4 yards. Lamont carried the ball through right tackle to 4-yard line. Tetlow went through left tackle for a touchdown after 15 minutes of playing. Tetlow kicked the goal. Score, 11-0.

'07 kicked off to Barnes who was downed on the 35-yard line. After a failure to gain through right tackle, Child punted to Tetlow at '07's 40-yard line. '08 gained the ball on a fumble. '08 lost 2 yards on a bad pass but retained the ball. Child punted to Tetlow at 30-yard line. '07 fumbled, Barnes, '08, getting the ball. Boylston carried the ball 2 yards. Putnam went through left tackle for 2 yards. Gerould carried the ball through left guard to the 35-yard line. Boylston went around left end for 4 yards. Gerould gained 3 yards through center, but '08 was penalized 5 yards for off-side play. Ellis went through center for 1 yard and Child tried a place kick which was blocked, '08 recovering ball.

Putnam went through left tackle for 2 yards, Glover gained 5 yards

through right tackle, Smith 3 yards, and Putnam 5 yards. '08 then lost 1 yard, and Child again tried a place kick which failed. Fuller returned the ball to the 30-yard line. '08 was penalized 5 yards, Fuller gained 1 yard, Lamont 2 yards, Fuller 4 yards, Godfrey 3 yards, and Lamont 10 yards. Tetlow carried the ball to '08's 33 yard line and Fuller went through centre for 4 yards, Lamont made 3 yards, Fuller 4 yards, Tetlow 10 yards, Lamont, 3 yards, Tetlow made no gain, and Fuller made 3 yards. Time was called with the ball on '08's 7-yard line. Score, first half '07 11, '08 0.

SECOND HALF.

'08 kicked off to Starkweather who carried the ball to 25-yard line. Fuller gained 5 yards, and 5 yards more on another try, and Tetlow carried the ball to 40-yard line. Fuller gained 3 yards. Tetlow gained 1 yard and then failed to gain. Lamont, Peabody and Tetlow netted eleven yards, Lamont 2 yards more, Seymour 6 yards, and Godfrey failed to gain. Peabody gained 3 yards. At this point Davis was substituted for Lamont. Seymour gained 5 yards, Fuller 7 yards, and Godfrey 7 yards. A. Allen took Rapelye's place, Tetlow carried the ball 3 yards, Peabody 7 yards, Davis 1 yard, Tetlow 3 yards, and then to 1-yard line; Fuller was then pushed over for a touchdown. Tetlow missed the goal. Score 16-0. '07 kicked off to Ellis at 30-yard line. Boylston was thrown for a loss of 4 yards on the next play. Child punted 40 yards to Tetlow who ran the ball back 20 yards before he was downed. Godfrey gained 3 yards, Fuller 5 yards, Seymour 4 yards, Tetlow one-half yard, 4 yards, and then 2 yards, and Fuller 4 yards. This brought the ball to '08's 20-yard line. M. Allen was substituted for Child. Peabody then took the ball for a 4-yard gain. Regnell was substituted for Hall. Tetlow went around right end for a touchdown. Tetlow kicked the goal. Score, 22-0.

Fuller kicked to Barnes who ran ball back 15 yards. Boylston was given the ball but did not gain. Barnes fumbled the next pass but recovered the ball. Glover punted
