15 yards. Fuller took the ball 2 yards, Tetlow 4 yards, and then Godfrey failed to gain on a quarter-back play. Davis next gained 4 yards, and Tetlow lost 1 yard. Peabody went through left tackle for 2 yards. Coupel was substituted for Godfrey at quarter back. Fuller made 2 yards through centre and was replaced by Davenport. '08 obtained the ball on downs.

Boylston took the ball through right tackle for a 2-yard gain. Heilman was thrown for a loss of 5 yards, and Glover punted 25 yards. '08 was penalized 5 yards for an off-side play. Williams was substituted for Putnam at left half back. Davis went around right end for 1 yard. Bryant was substituted for Tetlow. Davenport made 2 yards through center. Here time was called with the ball on '08's 26-yard line. Final score 1907-22; 1908-0.
