We regret to notice the error which appeared in the last issue of THE TECH in the date of the Civic Club meeting. The date stated was Tuesday, the regular day for the meetings of the Club. 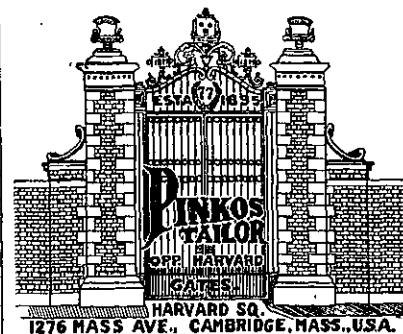
