
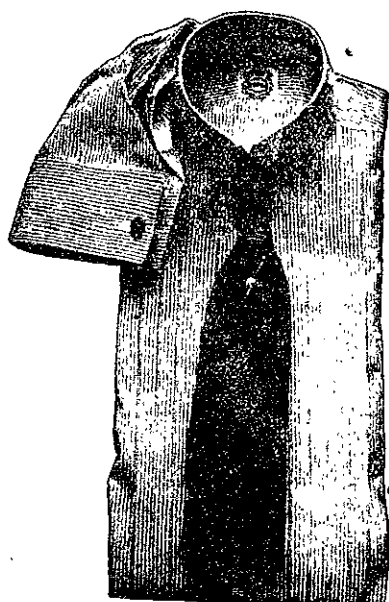

THEATRE ATTRACTIONS.

Park Theatre.
 Henry B. Harris' production of "The Lion and the Mouse" is scheduled for presentation at the Park Theatre, Monday night, when this, the latest play of Charles Klein, author of "The Music Master" and other successes, will be seen for the first time here. Tremont Theatre.
