MR. RICKARDS, '99, PROMOTED.

Burt R. Rickards, M. I. T. '99, has been appointed director of the bacteriological laboratory of the city Board of Health. He has been an assistant for the past five years, so that the appointment is a promotion. Mr. Rickards made a specialty of Chemistry, and after one year's teaching at the Lowell Textile School, he came to the Board of Health laboratory. His work there has been largely in the diagnosis of infectious diseases, and the devising of simpler but surer methods of examining suspected sputum and other depecta of disease. Mr. Rickards is a member of the American Public Health Association, the Society of American Bacteriologists, the American Chemical Society, and the Massachusetts Association of Boards of Health.
