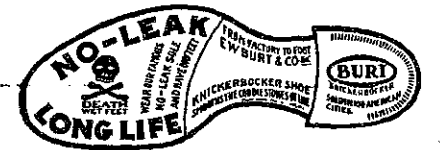

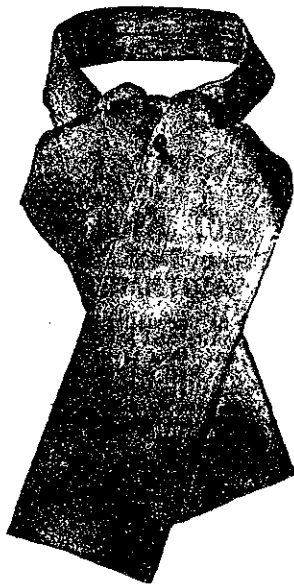

HYDRAULICS: COURSES II, III, VI, X, XIII. — Classes in Theoretical Hydraulics will meet after November 18, at hours scheduled on Tabular View. All exercises will be held in Room 54, Eng. A, except that from 9 to 10 Friday morning, which will be in 53 Eng. A. The text-book to be used is Merriman's "Treatise on Hydraulics," and students are expected to be prepared at the first exercise on Articles 11, 15, 16.

PHYSICAL LABORATORY. — The last exercise for students in Courses VI and VIII, and for students making up deficiencies will be on Saturday, November 25. A clear record

in Courses 773 and 774 is necessary for admission to the work in the electrical laboratory during the last five weeks.

Students in Courses I, V, and XI, should register in Room 16 Walker, not later than November 20, and obtain their assignment in Heat (see Laboratory Notes on Heat), prior to the first exercise, as reference to the notes is not permitted in the laboratory. The first exercise will be held on Monday, November 27.

Students in Courses II, VII, X, XII, and XIII beginning laboratory work will meet in Room 22 Walker, for instructions, on Thursday, November 23.

The exercises on the Precision of Measurements for Course II will begin as per Tabular View on Tuesday, November 28.
