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INTERCOLLEGIATE CROSS COUNTRY.

The Technology Cross Country team will be greatly handicapped in the Friday run. Although the first four contestants finishing for each college will score, Tech has only four men entered. The other colleges have teams of seven. The course is cross-country, with jumps and fences, and while the other teams run it annually it is new to the Tech runners. The length of the Traver's Island course is six miles and our men have had no practice at such a distance.

Cornell's team, twice the winner, will run without three of their best men. Pennsylvania has lost two men, Yale three, and the chances of Columbia and Princeton are not considered hopeful. While the Tech team is in good condition they lack enthusiasm, but not determination. Circumstances seem to indicate a good place for the team.

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The annual dual shoot between Yale and Harvard will be held this afternoon on Soldiers Field. Each University will be represented by a team of five men shooting in two strings at fifty birds thrown from a Magau trap.

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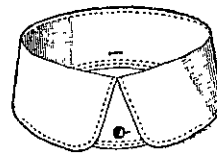
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
