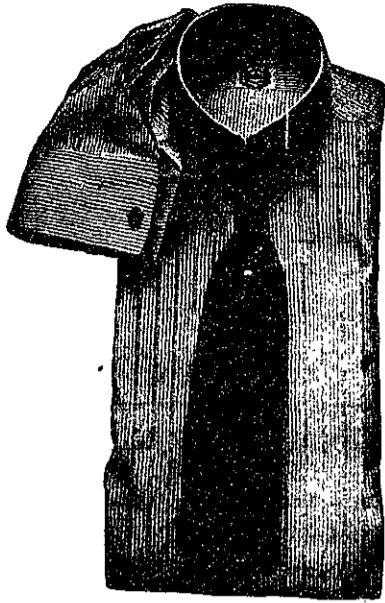

change which has come over the ideas of men on this subject. The Persians thought it sufficient to teach their boys "to ride, to shoot, and to speak the truth." Nowadays we are doubtful just how to train our young men, and it is this uncertainty which is one of the most perplexing features in the difficult problem of education today.

The undergraduate notes contain items of interest on athletics, on clubs and on Tech news generally, and graduate activities are well represented by accounts of the doings of Technology clubs and individuals all over the country. The volume closes with a review by Professor Talbot of President Pritchett's book, "What is Religion, and Other Student Questions." The subject matter of the five addresses is clearly brought out and the short article would form an admirable preface to the perusal of the little volume by any student.
