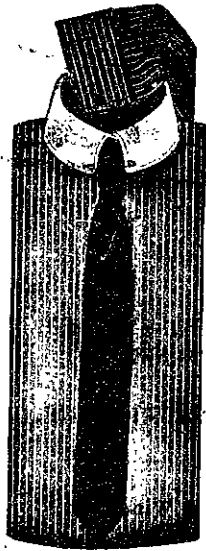

CHANGES IN THE FACULTY.

Various changes in the Faculty and executive officers of the Institute of Technology have taken place during the current year. Of these the most important is the appointment of Professor Dugald C. Jackson of the University of Wisconsin to the head of the Department of Electrical Engineering. Professor Jackson enters upon his work officially at the end of the first term but will keep in touch with the department from the beginning of the year.

Another change is made in this department by the appointment of Professor George C. Shaad as Assistant Professor of Electrical Engineering in place of Professor Puffer, who has resigned.

The Executive Committee has also made a change in the administrative conduct of the Institute by creating a place as Secretary of the Institute. Heretofore the Secretary of the Faculty has filled the

dual place of Secretary of the Faculty and Secretary of the Institute. The duties of the place have now become so burdensome that the Executive Committee has considered it wise to divide the work, so that the Secretary of the Institute might give his entire time to the work of administration and the conduct of correspondence, the editing of publications, assisting the President in all routine matters, and, in general, carrying out the administrative work which would fall to the Secretary.

This change leaves Professor Tyler, who has for many years combined both sets of duties, free to devote his main strength and work to the Department of Mathematics, of which he is the head. During his long service as Secretary, Professor Tyler has rendered most laborious and valuable service to the Institute, and has assumed an amount of routine administration and work of which few men are capable.
