Harvard has two eights from the Varsity squad on the river now.

The Cornell-Princeton football game will be played at the Polo Grounds, New York City, October 27. This is the first time the game has been played away from the grounds of one of the participating teams.

The Yale Athletic Association has issued a \$5 ticket to members of the Faculty and students, admitting them to all athletic contests. The ticket is transferable, and entitles the holder to half rates for the Harvard and Princeton contests.
