FRESHMEN, 6; BROOKLINE, 0.

In fifteen minutes of play, the Freshmen defeated Brookline High at Tech Field Friday afternoon, 6 to 0. The playing of both teams was erratic throughout, but Brookline was crippled, having five regulars out of the game and losing two more by injuries. Daniels, Brookline's star half-back, had his face cut open in a scrimmage, and a moment later Robart, the full-back, was led from the field with a badly wrenched arm. Only one half was played, both captains agreeing to stop because of darkness.

Brookline had everything her own way in the beginning of the half, and was carrying the ball steadily down the field when Daniels and Robart were injured. The Freshmen took a slight brace and, after an exchange of punts, made steady gains, Saul being sent over for a touchdown. There was no further scoring before time was called.

The Freshman team seemed to have taken a slump from its mark made in the Lowell Textile game, for the weak Brookline team ripped holes in the line time and again, and broke up interferences more than once. Lack of good scrimmage practice is still evident, and the team will have to work hard to get into condition before Nov. 16.
