The annual meeting of the Association of Colleges in New England was held this year at Yale University on October 29 and 30. Each of the New England colleges sent its president and one delegate to this gathering.

Harvard is sure to fare well in its kicking department for two more years at least, for Burr, whose phenomenal punting has featured recent games and practices, is only a sophomore, and intends to complete his course. Burr ranks high in his college studies, and no fear is entertained in that quarter.

These laboratories have been presented to the University by Mr. George Eastman of Rochester and will be devoted to the Departments of Physics and Biology. The address in Physics was given by Professor E. L. Nichols of Cornell University.
