country team, but he had some experience on the hare and hound runs last year. He made a good mark on the victorious relay team against Tufts. MacGregor was a member of the victorious Institute team against Harvard two years ago. He has been running in fine form this fall, and is looked upon as the strongest man of the team.

Captain Callaway was not in very good condition the first of the training season, having received several injuries. The light regime of training has however brought him around to something like his old form, and he will go into the race today fit to do himself full justice. As the fourth man to score for the Institute today will be the man to be taken to Princeton with these first three, the competition for this place will be exceedingly keen. All of the men are of about the same strength, and have been running very well together. It is hoped, and it is the only hope for a Tech victory that this competition will bring the team over the finish line well bunched, and win the race as Harvard did last year.

The race will start at about a quarter of two at West Roxbury, and if anything like former time is made the first man will cross the line at the Field before the quarter past mark, and all will be in before half-past the hour. Each team will enter ten men, but only five will figure in the scoring. The points will be counted, one for first, two for second, and so on, the team scoring the least number of points winning the contest.
