CROSS COUNTRY MEETING.

A meeting of the M. I. T. Cross Country Association will be held on Wednesday March 20 at 1 P.M. in 26 Rogers to act on an amendment to the Constitution of the Association.

The captain of the Cross Country Team has recently been elected by the vote of all members of the Association but it is now felt that this privilege should belong to the members of the Cross Country Team alone. The amendment, which was proposed by President H. R. Callaway, reads as follows: "The Captain of the Cross Country Team shall be elected annually by the members of the Team instead of by the Association as now provided in Article IV, Section 3 of the Constitution.

The executive committee of the Carnegie Institute at Washington has decided to erect a \$100,000 building in the vicinity of the Harvard Medical School, Longwood Avenue, Boston, for the purpose of studying food nutrition. The building will be a separate organization having no direct connection with the Medical School, but its proximity will probably be of advantage to its students. Prof. F. G. Benedict of Wesleyan University has been selected as director of the institution.
