Williams has certainly a right to claim the intercollegiate championship at basket ball now that Yale has decided not to play a post-season deciding game. The claim, however, would be based on rather doubtful victory and the Berkshire college is not crowing a great deal in this respect. What might have been the outcome of a post-season game between the regular teams of Yale and Williams is hard to tell. It would have been a close contest, at any rate. Yale's refusal to play this game is based on valid reasons which Williams recognizes as such, and in so much as Yale has not claimed everything in sight. Williams, showing the best sort of sportsmanship should be content to be first in her league and worthy of a tryout with her big university rival.

Harvard overseers have voted to accept the \$30,500 Shaler memorial fund on the terms governing its presentation.

More than 760 alumni have contributed to the fund, the conditions of which provide that part of the money shall be used in placing a tablet in the geological section of the university museum or some other suitable place designated by the corporation.

The income of the balance is to be used for the benefit of the division of geology in support of original research and in the publication of results. The committee in charge of the fund consists of Robert Winsor, W. M. Davis and Edward W. Atkinson.

Colorado College has been endowed with 100 pedigreed cats by Mayor Henry C. Hall, of Colorado Springs, Col.
