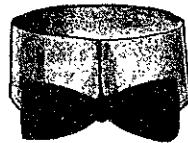

**NO CHANGE IN ELECTRICITY.**

Arizona. Turner is in charge of construction work in the South. Turkington works for J. G. White Co., Contractors, New York. McChesney is with the Utica and Mohawk Valley Electric R. R. Chaffee is taking a post-graduate course in physics at Harvard. Brock is in charge of the Y. M. C. A. here. Keeling, Harwood, and Pease are with Stone and Webster. Macomber left the latter concern after a few months and is now with the Hydro-Electric Power Co. of California. F. S. McGregor is engaged in developing an electro-static ore separator with Mr. Huff of Boston. H. A. Wentworth, '05, is also interested in the same enterprise.

Professor R. R. Lawrence took a ten days' trip late last spring to inspect the electrical laboratories of the central western and New York colleges. He visited Ohio State University, Purdue College, University of Illinois, University of Wisconsin, University of Michigan, Armour Institute, and Cornell.

In general Prof. Lawrence found the reports of the excellent equipment of these laboratories well founded. None of them are as extensively equipped as the M. I. T. electrical laboratories, although the buildings are better in finish and furnishings than Tech's temporary structures.

Ohio State and U. of I. have new buildings, while Purdue and U. of M. have recently rearranged their laboratories. U. of I. and U. of M. are probably the best of the group. Cornell has much antiquated apparatus which has not been replaced. There is a good equipment at Armour Institute, which, being a trade school, does not enter a comparison with the other colleges.

**JUNIORS PLAN ELECTION.**

Voting Not Allowed Unless Dues are Paid.

Yesterday noon the Junior Class held its first meeting of the year, to consider the subject of the class elections for the season. President Moses opened the meeting by reading from the class constitution the sections relative to the method of holding elections. A committee on elections, of five men, is to be appointed as soon as possible and a notice of their appointment published in THE TECH.

Nominations for class officers must be made in writing and signed by at least ten members of the class before presentation to the committee. If for any office there are less than three nominees the committee will select additional men to supply the deficiencies. Ballots will be printed and sent to the members.

Members of the class are those students who have now a majority of studies in the third year. Old members to be allowed the privileges of the class, including voting, must have paid all back dues and assessments, and a list of those who have not done so will be posted as soon as it can be made up.

New members from other colleges or classes will be allowed to vote. The delinquents will be given a week to pay up. The current annual dues are to be paid before Nov. 15th. The following collectors were appointed by courses: I, Green and Maynard; II, Jenkins and O'Shea; III, Dickerman; IV, Myers; V, Kelly; VI, Haynes and Lange; VII and VIII, G. A. Haynes; X, Gram; XI, Ware; XII and XIII, Jones.

Nominations for class officers will be received up to 4 P. M. on the day one week after the appointment of the election committee; and four days will be allowed for voting after the sending out of the ballots.
