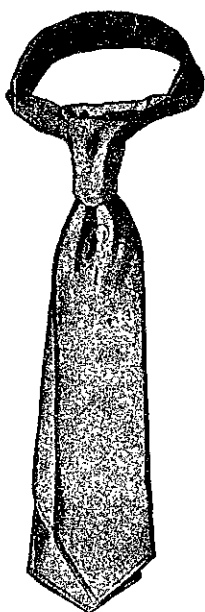

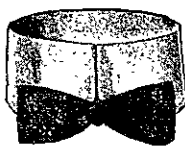

The new members of the instructing staff in this department have been announced as follows: Robert S. Williams, instructor in analytical chemistry, who returns from study in Germany; Dr. E. B. Spear, instructor in analytical chemistry, who for the past year has been research-assistant in physical chemistry; R. C. Tolman, instructor in theoretical chemistry, who is a graduate student in physical chemistry; C. R. Bragdon, assistant in theoretical chemistry, and O. L. Peabody, assistant in analytical chemistry, both graduates in chemical engineering of 1907; W. W. Kennedy, assistant in organic chemistry, a graduate of the University of Minnesota; Messrs. W. B. Gonder, assistant in analytical chemistry, H. W. Mahr, research assistant in technical chemistry, R. G. Woodbridge, Jr., research assistant in organic chemistry, and F. P. Shields, assistant in technical analysis, all graduates in chemistry of 1907; C. B. Nickerson, assistant in inorganic chemistry, a graduate from Clarke University at Worcester; and P. S. Fiske, a graduate of Harvard, '07. Dr. Miles S. Sherrill, formerly an instructor, has been appointed assistant professor in theoretical chemistry. John F. Norton, assistant in inorganic chemistry is transferred to industrial chemistry, and George F. White is transferred from analytical chemistry to organic chemistry.

Prof. Talbot has been appointed a member of the International Commission on Chemical Analysis. He will deliver a course of six lectures before the Brooklyn Institute of Arts and Sciences on the electrolytic dissociation theory and its applications to analytical chemistry during February and March of next year. Prof. W. H. Walker has been made vice-president of the New England section of the Society of Chemical Industry. Prof. Gill has accepted a position on the committee on analysis of oils and like materials, in connection with the International Congress of Applied Chemistry. D. E. Russ, '07, is with the Commonwealth Glue Co., and C. N. Draper, '07, returns as a graduate student.
