be made with a "path" not exceeding fifteen feet in width.

No competitor shall wear boots or shoes with any projecting nails, springs or points of any kind, or make any holes in the ground with his heel or in any way before the start; or wilfully touch the ground with any part of his person but his feet. The "Anchor" only may pass the rope around his body and may wear a suitable belt.

Any direct interference by any coach or spectator in any event may render the side assisted liable to disqualification by the referee, and his judgment shall be final.

Points will be counted as follows: Football game, four (4) points; relay race, three (3) points; tug-of-war, two (2) points.

Numerals will be awarded to members of both the football teams actually participating in the game, but not exceeding a total of sixteen men, to be designated by the captain or manager of the team, by letter to the Chairman of the Advisory Council, on Thursday, Nov. 7th.

Also to the members of the winning relay team and two substitutes, (the latter to be named on the day previous to the games.) and to the winning tug-of-war team.

The management of the games and all matters connected with same is vested in the Advisory Council, and may be delegated to any sub-committee it may appoint.

Football and whistles, flags for relay race, and flags and rope for tug-of-war, will be provided by the Advisory Council and referees, umpires, timers and other officials shall be appointed by it.

Any protest in connection with the above rules, must be filed with the Chairman of the Advisory Council not later than Monday, Nov. 4th.

and locality that has been looked into. These lists were until this year in the office of the Dean, who could not personally examine every room.

Plans for Bible and social discussion classes are under way. Four regular Thursday meetings have been held. The speakers were Rev. A. A. Hockdale and Rev. R. W. Jelliffe of Boston, Mr. C. C. Mercer of New York, and Prof. Talbot. Among those to speak are Prof. Dwight Porter, Dr. Mann, Dr. J. H. Denison, and Dr. Alexander, who will soon give a series of talks. The kindness of Dr. Mann and the vestry of Trinity Church and the co-operation of the Boston pastors and others insure Tech men of a pleasant place to meet and excellent talks to hear. These are not hysterical or deep and dry sermons but live thoughts and ideas for thinking men. They are part of the serious, persistent, and rational endeavor of the association to help the men at the Institute develop strong, noble, manly, and useful characters. Every Tech man is welcome, regardless of denomination.

The Y. M. C. A. is the only undergraduate activity employing a graduate secretary and through its receptions, weekly meetings, discussion classes, information and employment bureaus, touches more men than any other undergraduate organization.

As the work of the association grows from year to year, the disbursements are necessarily larger. This year it is estimated \$1200.00 will be needed to carry these plans to a successful finish. In the past the students have met these increased expenses and it is hoped that this year will prove no exception.
