All Commissioned Officers Are Sophomores.

According to a statement recently given out by Major Wheeler, work with the freshman battalion is progressing rapidly, in fact better than ever before. The spirit so far shown by the freshman class has been admirable, both in the matter of conduct and ability to work. So far during the year there has been no breach of discipline sufficiently grave to warrant punishment.
