Regulations on the counting of points, the time of events, and the latest qualifications for "T's" and numerals were given out by the Advisory Council on Athletics yesterday.

The points will be counted as follows: football game, four (4) points; relay race, three (3) points; tug-of-war, two (2) points.

The different events will be called at the following specified times: tug-of-war, (first trial) 2.15 P.M.; football (first half), 2.25 P.M.; relay race, 3.00 P.M.; tug-of-war (second trial), 3.10 P.M.; football (second half), 3.15 P.M.; tug-of-war (third trial, if necessary), 4.00 P.M. The members of all the teams must be on the Field at the time designated.
