DR. NOYES HONORED

Elected to Committee of National Academy of Sciences

At the meeting of the National Academy of Sciences, held at Baltimore last week, Acting-Pres. Arthur A. Noyes was made a member of an important committee, appointed by the Academy, in accordance with an Act passed by the last Congress, to "take into consideration the methods and expenses of conducting all surveys of a scientific character, and all chemical, testing, and experimental laboratories, and to report to Congress as soon thereafter as may be practicable a plan for consolidating such surveys, chemical, testing, and experimental laboratories so as to effectually prevent duplication of work and reduce expenditures without detriment to the public service." The other members of the Committee are President R. S. Woodward of the Carnegie Institution of Washington, chairman; President C. R. van Hise, of Wisconsin University; Professor E. L. Nichols, of Cornell University; and Professor W. W. Campbell, director of the Lick Observatory.
