As a whole the team first of all has the ability to score. Every man on the team can be depended upon to make a basket when needed. All are heavy enough to block well, a great help in the dribbling game, both offensive and defensive. Their weakest point is in their passing, and, team work in getting the ball to the forwards. This is because so many of the men are new and hence unused to the plays of the others, also because of the inconvenient times of practice which keep the men from showing up as regularly as they should; hence they do not get the team work down as fine as they might.

One detriment to the team is the absence of men of the necessary strength and experience practicing regularly on the second team to put up a consistent, strong game against the varsity squad. Assistant Manager R. E. Schatz 1911, has charge of the second team schedule and has arranged several games with Bridgewater Normal, Harvard, and Tufts, second teams, and with some of the stronger high school fives.

The work on the second team will be much more interesting than formerly because of the games with the class teams. It is expected that the competition for places on the team will be keener than ever before.

The class teams are both well supported and many candidates showed up at practice last Saturday. The sophomores have a game arranged with the Harvard and the Tufts freshmen.

The first game of the Institute team will be played against Boston College on Wednesday Dec. 9, at the Tech Gym. Boston College always sends over a first-class aggregation, and the game promises to be interesting, not only as a game, but also as a means of judging the strength of this year's team.

With such a bright outlook for the season the Gym should be crowded to the limit on Wednesday night to start the team off with the support they deserve, and to make them realize that the whole Institute is backing them.
