from James First; "Massossoit," Indian Chief; "Philips," young Frenchman; "Young Billington," a second Peck's Bad Boy; and "Long Boy," a town crier.

Before asking for candidates Coach Francis made a few remarks about the show and character of the work. The book is the best that has ever been written for a Tech Show, and the success of the play depends simply upon the discipline and work done by principals and chorus. He further advised all men not making principals parts to go for the chorus, which will consist of about 36 persons, 18 men and 18 girls, and six dancers.

The play itself is a satire on the Pilgrims leaving Holland for this country. The first act opens in Holland and contains several dances and love scenes. The second has several scenes from Plymouth and Boston in 1635, and a special edition by Willy Hearst to permit them landing in this country.

The performances of the play have not yet been arranged but two performances will be given in Boston at the Hollis, and several in outside towns.

The chorus will practise for the first time Saturday at 2 P. M. in the Union and on Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons of each week.

The candidates for principal parts will rehearse on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, first practice being today at 4.15 in the dining hall of the Union. This arrangement is simply a temporary one, as permanent training quarters for the show will be found later.
