**TRACK MEET AT FIELD**

Intercollegiates to be Held at Brookline this Year

Tech field has again been chosen for the annual meet of the New England Intercollegiate A. A. At a special meeting of the association held at the Hotel Lenox, Feb. 6, there was not a single dissenting vote when the question was put—a letter from Mr. Frank Bigelow, who owns the Worcester Oval, where the meet has been held previously, was first read. Then Manager Fernstrom of the M. I. T. track team put his proposition in favor of Tech field. He said that 35 tons of "blown spark" cinders were put on the track last fall to eliminate the tendency to "cup." This was the only objection the athletes had to the track last spring. When the cinders are rolled in the spring it is the opinion of experts that Tech will have the best track in New England. The contract agreed to is practically the same as the one last year except a few minor changes in the matter of the choice of officials. There was some discussion as to who should bear the expense of having record medals struck. The colleges represented at the meeting were Technology, Dartmouth, Amherst, Wesleyan, Brown, University of Maine, Williams, Bowdoin, and Tufts. Trinity and University of Vermont were not represented.

A hot discussion took place on the new constitution which the executive committee submitted. The admission of Holy Cross and the election of officers was put over till the annual meeting, February 20.
