OUTDOOR WORK BEGINS

Many Take Advantage of the Fine Weather to Get to Field

Although the attendance at the Field this week has been fair, there is plenty of opportunity for more men. According to Coach Kanaly, the track is in better condition than ever before, and the weather ideal for so early in the season. Some men have complained in the past about the track, but they can have no kick now.

The hopes for first place in the Inter-collegiate are very good, as with the exception of the broad jump, likely candidates are showing up for the field events.

In the sprints the most promising men are Lockett, Reed, Grant, Walker, Fox, Murray, Mangan, Oettinger, Robinson, and Whipple. It is not definitely known as yet whether Seligman will run this spring, and if this crack sprinter decides to withdraw from active work this year, his loss will be severely felt. The quarter is well taken care of. How well is shown by the fine showing made by the quartette of 440-yard men who composed the varsity relay team. P. D. White, the crack half-miler of the sophomore class, is the only man of first class ability in the 880, and there is a fine chance for men in this event. It will be hard to fill the place of L. O. Mills in the mile, but the cross-country team should furnish some good men. So far MacCreddie, Eldred, Howland, Campbell and C. S. Robinson have been all.

New men are coming out for the weight events in fine shape, and the following ten have been doing faithful work: Burbon, Duyser, Mayers, Stuart, Grotz, Nisbet, Parker, Wentworth, Gott, Richards, Chamberlin and Bray. The high jump will be taken care of by Stuart, Ray, Allen and Dalrymple. In the pole vault, W. D. Allen 1911, the present record holder, is the main standby.

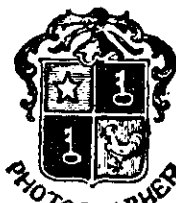
