SPRING HANDICAP MEET

Will be Preliminary Test of
Ability for Intercollegiates

Below is a list of handicaps as arranged by Coach Kanaly for the handicap meet tomorrow. Mr. Kanaly has entered six men in each event of the New England Intercollegiate which will be held May 21 and 22 at the Tech Field. Only four of these men will be allowed to compete in an event, and the four who will compete will be determined largely by the result of the handicap meet.

The regular fourteen events will be run off, and it is desired that competition will be such as to force fast enough times for comparison with those made by other colleges this spring.


