CURRENT EVENTS

The inauguration of Ernest Fox Nichols, D.Sc., LL.D., as tenth president of Dartmouth College, will take place on Thursday morning, October 14, in Webster Hall of the Hanover institution. A college holiday has been ordered by the trustees on the occasion, and an invitation to participate in the celebration has been extended to the presidents of all the well-known colleges and universities throughout the country.

Following in the paths of several of the leading colleges of the country, Trinity College has substituted a "football" rush in place of the so-called "push" rush of former years. A football is placed in the centre of the football field, the sophomores lining up under one goal post and the freshmen under the other. At a given signal both classes rush for the ball, the class having possession of it at the end of a stated period being declared the winners.

An event of interest to all Americans will occur on October 6, in Stratford-on-Avon, England; namely, the official opening to the public of the "Harvard House," the home of the mother of John Harvard. The house has been restored as far as possible to its original state, and has been presented to Harvard University by Edward Morris, of Chicago.

Harry Payne Whitney, after landing at Newfoundland, asserted that Cook's Eskimos at Etah told him that Peary's men were hounding them in an effort to make them tell the story the Peary men wanted to hear. He also reiterated the charge that Peary made him swear not to bring anything of Cook's being aboard, and that ten years ago Peary similarly treated Explorer Qverdup.

The letter condemns especially co-education, saying that the "mixture of the two sexes is contrary to morality and unworthy of a civilized people."
