

NEW DESCRIPT. SYSTEM

Under the new scheme each of the 22 sections of the first year class has an instructor and one of the four small drawing rooms, into which 43 Rogers has been divided, assigned to it. At the first and last exercises of the week, after the lecturing in Huntington Hall, it is necessary to put two sections in the same room, but as it is planned to give mechanical drawing at these exercises, this is not so important. At the mid-week exercise, however, there will be but one section to a room, and it is at this exercise that the descriptive geometry is to be taught. The four rooms will be in charge of the following instructors: Mr. H. K. Barrison, Mr. A. L. Goodrich, Mr. S. A. Breed and Mr. S. E. Gideon. The ground covered by the course will be the same as in previous years, but the details and order of instruction will be left to the men in charge of the section.

The course in second year descriptive geometry will be conducted in the same manner as last year by Professors Ervin Keni on and H. C. Bradley, although as the drawing will be done in 50 Rogers, the sections will be necessarily be smaller.

The course in freehand drawing is in charge of Mr. Frank M. Gracey.

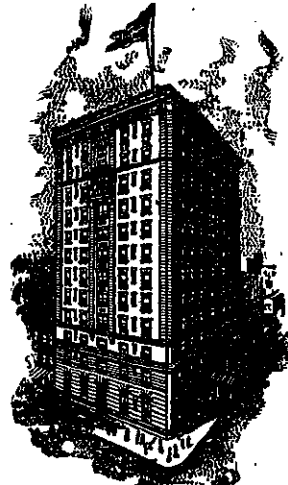

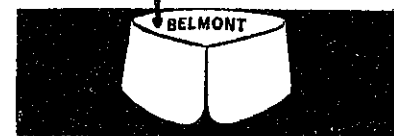
