**WIRELESS SOCIETY**

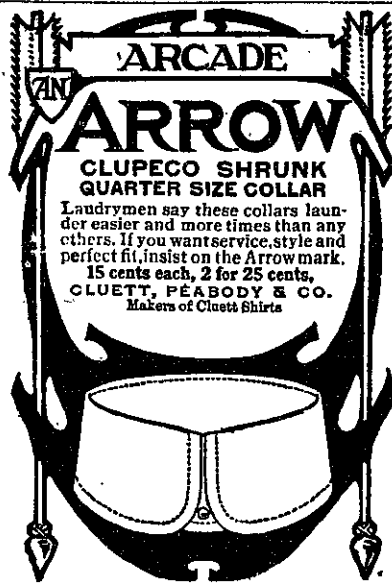

An interesting series of lectures will be given this winter. Among others, Mr. Collins of New York, the inventor of the Collins system of wireless telephony, has offered to demonstrate his invention.

Members of the society have offered their private apparatus for the use of the society and it will not be long before four or five sets of instruments, representing the different systems, will be available for study. It is planned to erect the receiving station first, and later to establish a powerful transmitting station. Further, the society hopes to publish an annual pamphlet of its proceedings, and of experiments carried on by its members.

- Of these men, perhaps half a dozen have stations now in operation.



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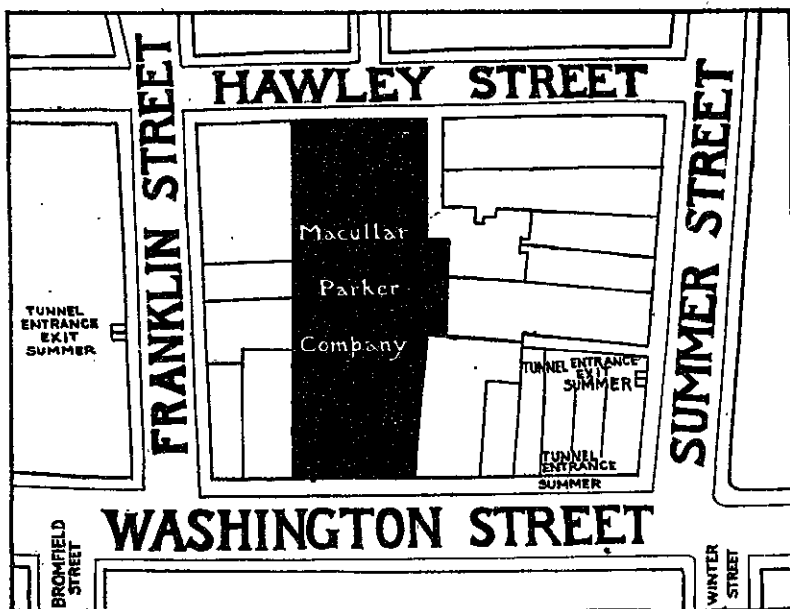
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
