is, it is considered one of the most valuable studies an architectural student pursues.

The result of the instruction in life class can be seen in the panels of the frieze in Huntington Hall, all of which were designed and drawn by graduate students in architecture.

Scientific construction is continually becoming a more necessary part of the architect's profession and the student's training is such as to enable him to control intelligently the usual structural questions. His knowledge of construction must be broad and thorough, whether the architect is prepared to accomplish all of this himself or must be aided by other agencies, the fact remains that he is responsible for his building as a whole, not only for its decorative side, but its construction, its planning, and its final equipment, with complicated systems of mechanical, electrical, and sanitary apparatus.

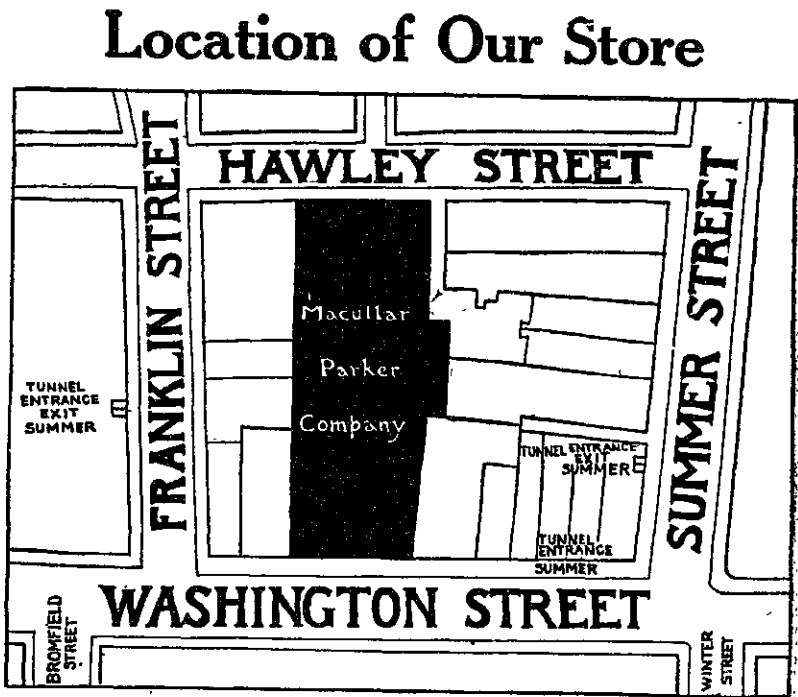
