**CURRENT EVENTS.**

Prince Hirobumi Ito, former Japanese president general of Korea and probably Japan's foremost statesman, was assassinated at Harbin, Manchuria yesterday afternoon, by a Korean who had followed him thither for that express purpose. The motive of the assassin was revenge. Prince Ito has just left the railroad car when the attack was made upon him. Accompanied by Russian Minister of Finance Kokovsoff, he started to inspect the guard of honor drawn up to welcome him, when several shots were fired in quick succession. The former president general of Korea fell mortally wounded. Three of the prince's companions were also wounded, bullets striking Japanese Consul General Kawakan, General Manager Tanaka of the South Manchurian Railway, and Prince Ito's private secretary.
