CURRENT EVENTS

A large number of specimens obtained in Egyptian excavations have been given to the University of Pennsylvania.

The University of Michigan has formed a Dixie Club.

The Cunard line steamer Lucania has been sold for scrap.

May cotton is up to fifteen cents.

Scholarship awards and elections to Phi Beta Kappa were announced at Dartmouth on Saturday. This is done with the idea of giving to the good scholars of the class, at least a portion of the fame that the prominent athletes enjoy.

A new record was made yesterday at the closing cycle meet of the Vailsburg, N. J., season, when Jack Clarke won the 25-mile open race in 56 minutes 21 seconds, breaking the old record of 57 minutes 26 3-5 seconds.

Professor A. Platt Andrew of Harvard University yesterday took oath of office as director of the Washington Mint and entered at once upon his duties.

Lieutenant Tibaldos, the naval officers who led the recent revolt against the Greacian Government, and a companion, Lieutenant Dimoulis, were arrested yesterday. All of the principal figures in the mutiny are now in custody.

Despatches reached Cape Haitien, San Domingo, yesterday, stating that Government troops had an encounter with the insurgents near Guayabin, in which they lost—five killed and eleven wounded. The Government forces were dispersed, the insurgents remaining masters of the situation. They re-entered Guayabin, which is one of the towns they seized a few weeks ago.

The American League at its annual meeting next month, the exact date of which has not been decided, will take up seriously the matter of abolishing spikes from the paraphernalia of the diamond.

Dr. Frederick A. Cook, who is in New York, after a lecture tour in the West, commenced yesterday to assemble the papers and reports of his Polar explorations in preparation of the data which he intends to submit to the University of Copenhagen within the next few days. Dr. Cook said he would devote his entire time to the preparation of his report to the Danish scientists until it was completed and forwarded, as he had promised.

The Alco entry won the Vanderbilt cup race Saturday afternoon, passing the Chalmers and Fiat entries in the last two laps of the race. The Chalmers finished first in the race for smaller cars, with the No. 46 Maxwell in second place and the No. 44 Maxwell third. Thousands crowded the course in Long Island, over which the race was held.

Dartmouth conferred upon President Angell of Michigan, the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws. Dr. Angell had already thus been honored by Columbia, Rutgers, Yale, Brown, Princeton, Vermont, Wisconsin, Harvard and Johns Hopkins.

General Weyler, Spanish ex-Minister of War, has been appointed captain general of Catalonia. Former Minister Snarez Inclan has been appointed civil governor of Barcelona.
