

ALUMNI'S NEW BOOK

Hollis Godfrey 1898 Writes Another Exciting Story

"For The Norton Name" is the title of Hollis Godfrey's latest book. After the publication of "The Man, Who Ended the War" he turned his attention to an "Elementary Chemistry."

The first book is an amazing story of scientific impossibilities woven into an almost plausible novel, a romance of magic, in which metals turn to gas and the fleets of the world are destroyed by one man.

The new book is not, however, of recent origin, but is reprinted from a serial which ran in the Youth's Companion. Nevertheless it is an absorbing account of a boy's defeat of lawyers, police and desperadoes. It appears as the first of a series, "Young Captains of Industry."

Mr. Godfrey 1898, is a teacher of chemistry, but has extended his field to public health.

SLIDE RULE LECTURE

The last of the series of seven lectures by Prof. Derr on the use of the Slide Rule in the solution of engineering problems will be given this afternoon at 4:00, in 23 Walker.

The first portion of the lecture will be devoted to a general discussion of the precision obtainable with the slide rule. This will be followed by a description, illustrated with lantern slides, of several varieties of rules and numerous other calculating machines on the market.

MECHANICAL LABORATORY

At the mechanical laboratories, the electric lighting system was put into commission last week. The equipment consists of a Sturtevant 25 KW. direct connected unit, multipolar compound generator, and a Crocker Wheeler balances set enabling the 230 volt power circuit to be cut to a three wire 115 volt system. Lights have been placed at each machine in both Machine Tool and Wood Turning Departments, and overhead in the Forging Laboratory and Wash Room.

All interest in the athletic world is now centered in the football game scheduled for next Saturday between Harvard and Yale. Until last Saturday, when Harvard made such a strong showing against Dartmouth the experts generally conceded the contest to Yale, but now it is believed that Harvard with her good second string men in reserve, has at least an equal chance.

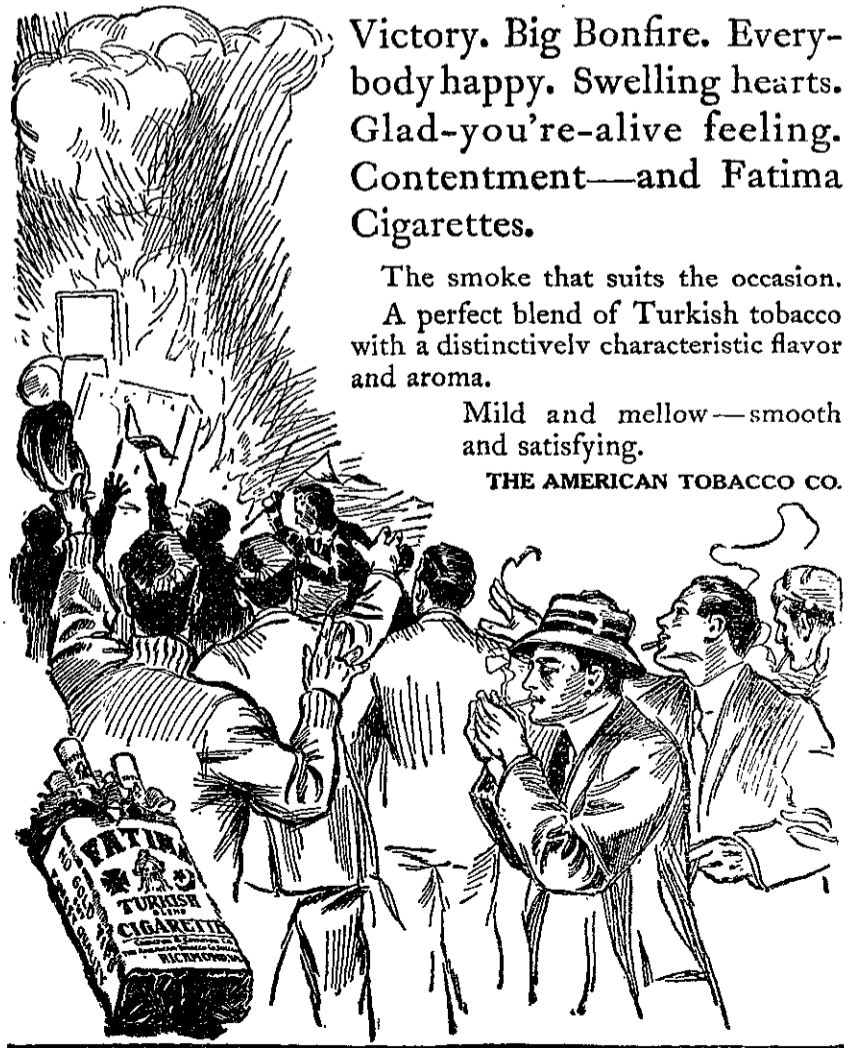
