leathers; these are called collodian cottons.

Higher percentages of nitrogen are contained in gun cottons and other explosives. Acetates do not burn as rapidly as the nitrates.

For this reason films and other products which are liable to burn easily are now being made in place of the older style of nitrate films.

Cellulose acetate is also used in insulating very fine wires, some not thicker than .003 of an inch.
