

COURSE VI NOTES

Part of the new machinery to be installed in the electrical engineering laboratory has arrived, but not a sufficient amount of it to warrant its being set up.

Attention of all third year course VI men is called to the fact that work in the electrical engineering laboratory will begin on Wednesday, December 8. All men are to register in Room 10 Walker building before Friday, December 10. The laboratory will be open for work afternoons from two to five o'clock. All laboratory work in Heat (Physics III,) must be completed before work in the electrical laboratory. Physical Laboratory notes "Part II," "Special Directions," title sheets, regular ruled laboratory paper, and a set of five place log tables.

Attention of Seniors is called to the fact that the electrical engineering laboratory closes at five o'clock in the afternoon and the library at five thirty. This rule applies to all men, whether doing thesis work or not.

Special permission must be obtained in order to use the library during the evenings for thesis work.

A large delegation from Course VI, took advantage of the opportunity to

inspect the L street power station of the Edison Illuminating Company. Two more groups are yet to go to this station, one to-day and the last Monday, December 6.

The membership of the Electrical Engineering Society is divided into three classes, active, associate and honorary. Any members of the Senior or Junior Classes of Course VI or Course VIII, are eligible for active membership. Any member of the Sophomore Class in either of these courses is eligible for associate membership. Honorary membership is confined to professors, instructors, and members of the alumni. It seems probable that in the near future men taking Electro Chemistry will be eligible to membership in the Electrical Engineering Society.

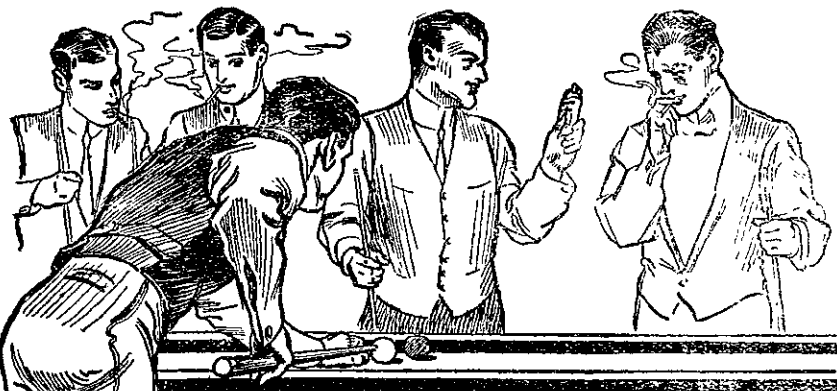
