BIOLOGICAL NOTES

Professor Sedwick will give an illustrated lecture on "Public Health and Sanitary" at Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio, on Saturday evening, December fourth.

Professor Winslow has been chosen first Vice-President of the newly organized American Association for the Study and Prevention of Infant Mortality.

Professor. E. B. Phelps gave an ad-

dress on Wednesday evening on "The Disinfection of Sewage," before the Sanitary Section of the Boston Society of Civil Engineers. Professor Winslow, Mr. H. W. Clark, and Mr. S. D. M. Gage, formerly students of the Institute, were among the experts present who took part in the discussion. Professor Phelps will participate later in the week in the annual meeting of the New Jersey Sanitary Association to be held at Lakewood, where he will give an illustrated lecture on "The Sewage Disposal Plants of New Jersey." Mr. Selskar Gunn, M. I. T. 1905, now Health officer of Orange, N. J., will address another meeting of the same Association on "Infant Mortality and the Responsibility of Board of Health in its Prevention," while Mr. Daniel D. Jackson, M. I. T. 1893, will give an illustrated lecture on "The House Fly as a Carrier of Disease."

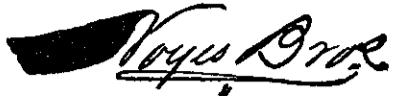
