**WASHINGTON, D. C.**

Washington, Feb. 10.—A bill making Commander Robert E. Peary, U. S. N., discoverer of the north pole, a rear admiral, was passed by the Senate yesterday. Indications are that the measure will also receive the approval of the House.

Washington, Feb. 10.—Under the authority granted by the tariff act of Aug. 5, 1909, Pres. Taft issued proclamations stating that the following named countries do not unduly discriminate against goods imported from the United States, and therefore are entitled to the minimum or schedule rates of the new tariff: Argentina, Brazil, Uruguay, Paraguay, Mexico, Panama and Liberia.

Washington, Feb. 10.—No changes are to be made in the present rates of postage for magazines and newspapers. An investigation by Postmaster-General Meyer showed that they would be severely handicapped by an increase.

**FOREIGN.**

Paris, Feb. 10.—The river Seine has risen nine inches in this city during the 24 hours ending at noon yesterday. The rise is due to the increased volumes of its affluents above Paris, which were swollen by rain and melting snow.

Madrid, Feb. 9.—The Spanish cabinet, headed by premier Morety Prendergast, resigned this afternoon. The ministerial crisis was brought about by the right wing of the Liberal party protesting against the premier's alliance with the Republicans.

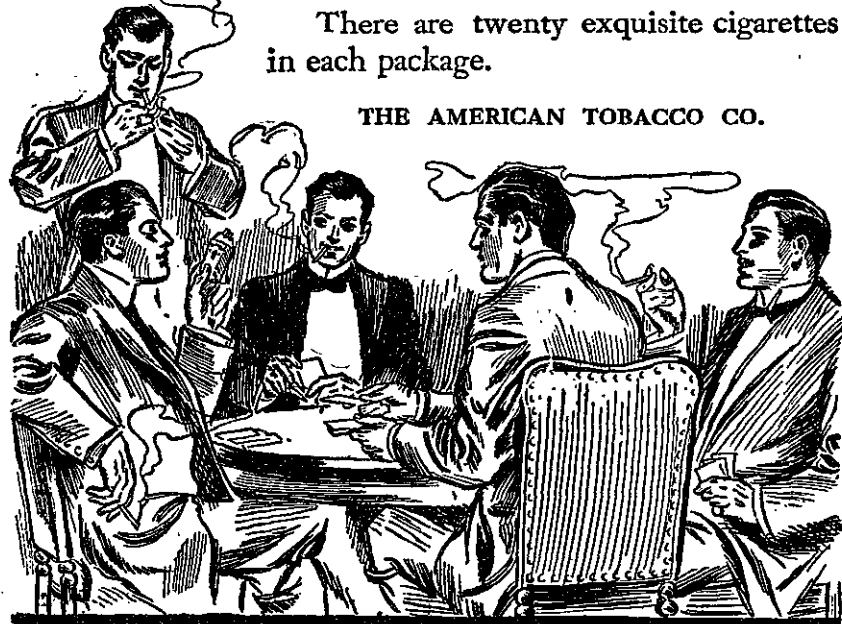
