Mr. Duncan showed by figures that the demand for rubber articles is increasing much faster than the supply of rubber, and that this is the cause for the large increase in the price of all rubber goods.

The experimental department of the Hood Rubber Co. employs four chemists, two machine designers, four mechanical engineers, two architects, several stenographers, and many assistants. The work is divided among the following four committees: Research Committee, Machine Committee, Development Committee, and Testing Committee. These committees are further separated into divisions, each one of which has its special line of work.

In closing, Mr. Duncan urged all students of chemistry to learn, not only their chemistry, but also the designing and handling of machines, and the interpretation of drawings. Only when he has this knowledge is a chemist in a position to apply and interpret the results he obtains in the laboratory.
