Mexico City, Mar. 5.—A concession for a railroad 650 miles long, forming the connecting link between Mexico City and Meridia, Yucatan, has been granted by the federal government to American capitalists. Work of construction will be begun at once.

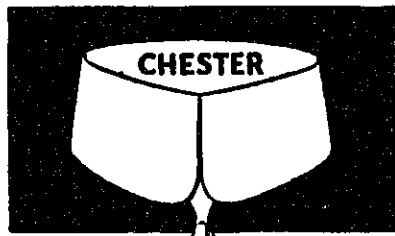

divides into skilled labor and unskilled labor. The latter class is sub-divided into trained help, which is not necessarily skilled, and untrained help, such as factory helpers, laborers, etc. The handling of all "help," whether skilled or unskilled, is a problem of great difficulty, and one which must be solved in each particular case. The only general statements which Mr. Whitaker made were that piece-work resulted in greater profit for both employer and employee, that payment should be proportioned to the value produced, and that a system of co-operation in which the employees were permitted to share in the benefits derived from improvements always resulted in the employees taking more interest in the business of the corporation.

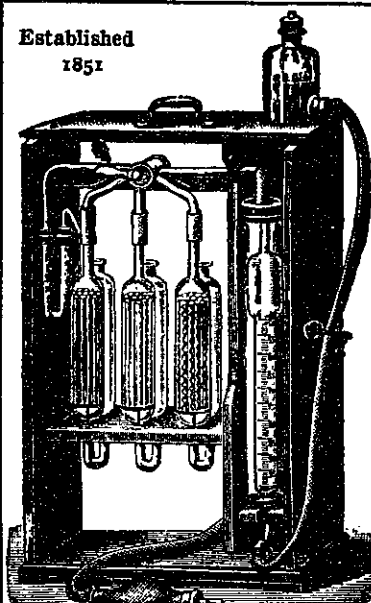
