TELEGRAPH NEWS OF THE MORNING.
WEATHER REPORT.

Fair and warmer Friday; moderate to brisk southwest to west winds.

Rome, March 25.—Reports from Catania say that the eruptions from Mt. Aetna are increasing in fury and that lava is nearing the villagers. The inhabitants in a panic are fleeing. Four new mouths in the mountain side have opened, and the fiery fluid is invading the cultivated lands. The town of Nicoloci is said to be in imminent peril of being destroyed.

The floods continue in Calabria and elsewhere in southern Italy. The rivers have overflowed their banks, several towns have been cut off from communication with the outside world, the railways are interrupted and considerable damage has been done to private property.

Seven violent earth shocks of volcanic origin have occurred at Mileto, province of Catanzaro. Similar shocks were felt at Messina.

Prof. Ricco of the Mt. Aetna observatory telegraphed that throughout the night and early this morning more than twenty slight shocks had been felt with increasing intensity on the slopes of the volcano.

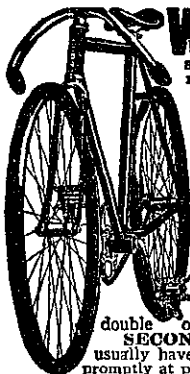

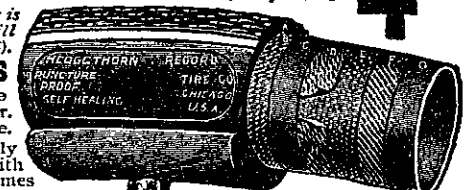
