THE HARVARD-YALE DEBATE

The subject for the Harvard-Yale freshman debate at New Haven on Friday evening, April 29, is: "Resolved, That the United States should adopt a system of subsidies, other than our present mail subsidies, for the encouragement of our merchant marine." Harvard has until next Monday to decide which side of the question it will defend. The preliminary trials will be held Wednesday. Twelve men will be chosen and from the third trial on next Monday, six men will be retained, three of whom will be picked by the judges to debate against Yale.
