Charles Klein's drama, "The Third Degree," begins tonight the last fortnight of its return engagement at the Colonial Theatre.

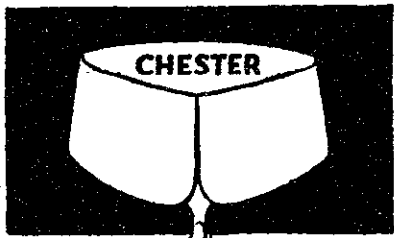
GLOBE THEATRE.

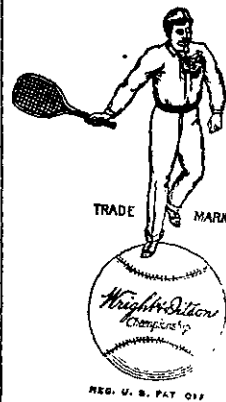

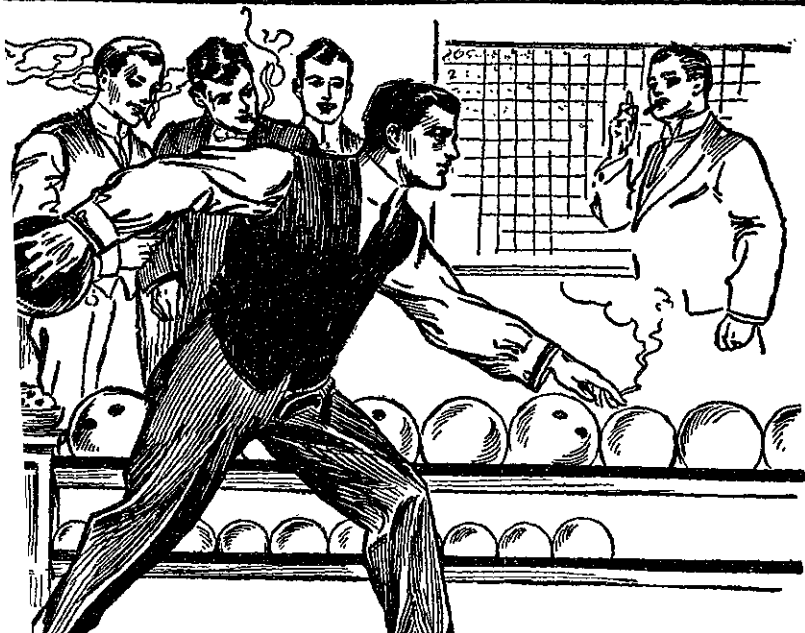
