 any contestants except in the one-mile relay event. Last year Saptain Gram entered in the 100-yards dash and finished third in his heat. The time for last year's relay race was 3 minutes, 31 2-5 seconds, which is rather slow time.

These relay races have been held annually on the last Saturday in April by the University of Pennsylvania, since their inauguration 15 years ago, and they have always brought together the fastest men in the entire American college world. For several years some one or other world's record has been lowered in the "Relays" and this year all indications point to a repetition of this practice. Officials of wide reputation have been engaged for the relays and the field events, which are run off at the same time on Franklin Field. The present meet eclipses all previous ones in the number of entries, a total of 1,600 contestants' tickets having been issued.

This year a new system of numbering contestants will be introduced. The team holding the pole at the start will be numbered 1, the second 2, and so on. This will help to keep the identity of the various competitors clear to the spectators who, in the past, have been forced to rely upon the colors and insignia of the different men and, as frequently the contestants do not wear any distinguishing uniform, it has been extremely difficult to follow them.
