success, and a shell was secured from the St. Alphonsus A. C.

This new acquisition will aid materially in developing a strong crew for next year, since with two eights practicing a squad will be rounded into shape which will be able to start next spring on a regular rowing schedule. This year the crew will not attempt to row any of the strong college crews, but by next year it is sincerely hoped that a good schedule will be arranged. Every day there are several crews practicing on the river; from Harvard, Stone School, and several of the other preparatory schools. Next Saturday the Institute crews will row against one of the strong Harvard crews, and a chance will be given to "get a line" on the Institute aggregation under actual rowing conditions.

A call for candidates for position on the new shell will be issued at once.
