A concrete swimming tank to cost \$12,000 is under construction at the University of California.

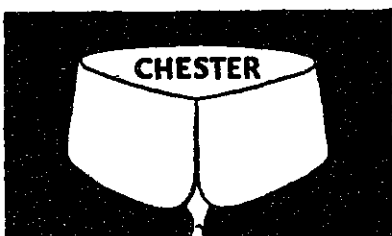
An Aero Club has been organized at Princeton with over twenty charter members.

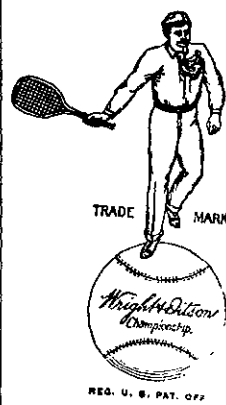

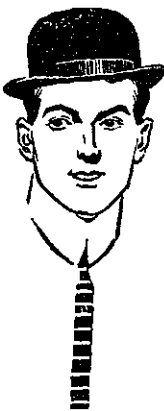

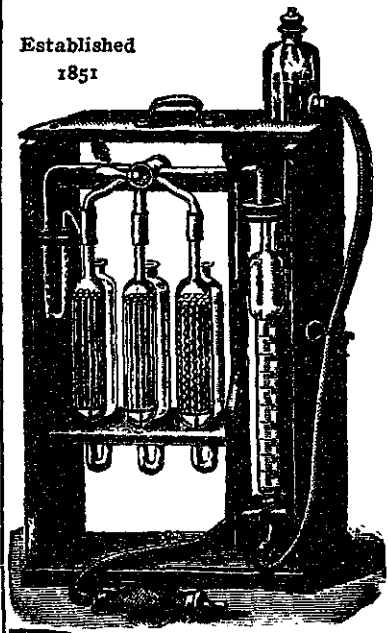
