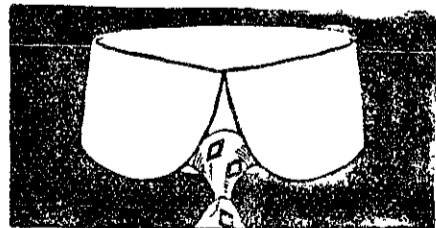

COURSE XV STUDIES.

Additional Subjects and Faculty Enlargement This Year.

The new school year marks the beginning of the full development of the courses in Engineering Administration. The original work as presented by Dr. Davis R. Dewey, under whose care the course is given, began with the current Sophomores of two years ago. A year later special features of the course were emphasized and additions made to the instructing staff.

This year those originally in the course are Seniors and the scope of the special work widens so that business law, cost accounting, business management, taxation, etc. are added to the engineering studies. The fourth year studies are specialized for different branches of engineering work, so that there are in reality three administration options open to the choice of the student, who may relate the business courses to civil engineering, mechanical and electrical engineering or chemical engineering, according to his desires.

To provide for the instruction in the course, additions have been made to the instructing force, namely Floyd E. Armstrong, to be assistant professor of Economics; E. O. Christiansen, to be instructor in Business Management and Professor Lincoln P. Schaub, A. M., LL. B., to be lecturer in Business Law.

PLUMBING THESES.

Nelson Prize Committee Announces \$200 Awards.

The committee in charge of the Nelson prizes in plumbing announces that during the year 1916-1917, two hundred dollars will be awarded for the best papers on the practice or theory of plumbing. These prizes are called the Nelson prizes in honor of Mr. N. O. Nelson, who has devoted himself as a manufacturer of plumbing supplies to the sound development of business and the general improvement of living conditions.

Papers must be in the hands of the committee by April 1, 1917, and must not contain more than five thousand words. The contest is open to Technology and Harvard students, or other students and men who have had practical experience in the installation of house drainage systems.

The prizes are as follows: One hundred dollars for the best paper in all classes; fifty dollars for the second best paper in all classes, and fifty dollars to be awarded as follows: if the first prize is awarded in one class, and the second prize in another class, the third prize shall be awarded for the best paper in the remaining class. In event of both the first and second prizes being awarded in one class, two third prizes of fifty dollars each will be awarded, one in each of the two remaining classes. For further information, applicants should communicate with Professor George C. Whipple of Harvard University.
