**PROFESSOR CRAM DESIGNS WHEA-
TON CHAPEL**

Professor Ralph Adams Cram, head of
the Architectural Department, has de-
signed a chapel for Wheaton College,
the cornerstone of which was laid
Saturday. The chapel is to be built in
the simple colonial style of the New
England meeting houses of the early
nineteenth century.

The chapel building will consist of an
auditorium in front and a chancel at the
back, the latter being equipped with a
\$10,000 electric organ. The exterior is
to be of red brick, trimmed with white
wooden columns. All the interior wood-
work will be painted white and the
rooms will be lighted by small paned
glass windows, giving the whole chapel
the atmosphere of the old New England
churches.

Professor Cram has been the consult-
ing architect of Wheaton College for a
number of years, and planned the chapel
several years ago.

THE SOPHS' BRICKLEY

Thomas Star Performer with Toe—
Practice Game Tomorrow

The Sophomore football team is round-
ing into shape as a very powerful ma-
chine. The team was seen in action at
Tech Field last Friday when they scrim-
maged against the Cambridge Latin
eleven, and tomorrow afternoon a prac-
tice game will be held with this same
team at 4.00 o'clock.

In Thomas, the left halfback of the
team, the 1919 eleven has a remarkable
dropkicker, his performance during the
past week being a great boost to the
Tech team. He has been booting the ball
across the bar with apparent ease from
the 30 and 40 yard lines. Within this
distance the Sophs will have no trouble
scoring three points on the freshmen.

The last call for candidates for the
1919 eleven is made for this afternoon,
and after this time no new men will be
permitted to work with the squad. The
final preparations for the game with the
freshmen will begin today. The Sopho-
more squad numbers 20 men and there
is keen competition for all of the posi-
tions. The backfield at present is com-
posed of Thomas, Young and Merrill as
the trio with Davis at quarterback. In
the line, Capt. Shippey, Hunt and Orcutt
are all three making strong bids for
tackle, while Strobridge and G. F.
Falkenberg have a monopoly of the
guards for the present. L. Falkenberg is
at center. There are four ends all work-
ing hard for the position, Clarkson, Ras-
mussen, Bruno and Brown.

The team will have practice this af-
ternoon at 4.00 o'clock, and tomorrow
will report at 3.00 o'clock in order to
get in some signal practice before the
game at 4.00. No admission to the game
will be charged.

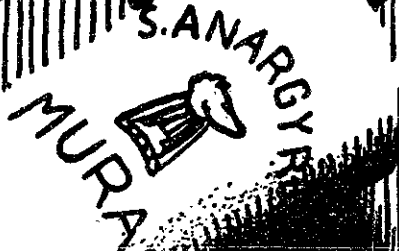
